Artist: Mia Cera Salsio

Mia Salsiö is a Swedish Albanian Australian artist. She learnt to read music from a young age, later graduating from the Victorian College of the Arts in music improvisation. Her subsequent degree in visual art led Salsjö to arranging numeric systems, visual art and music into complex multidisciplinary works and performances

Salsjö's projects are grounded in complex code-based systems, encompass drawing, music composition, text, performance, video, and textile-based works. Recent exhibitions include The Bridge: A Score for Sydney Harbour Bridge, (2023) Museum of Contemporary Art Australia, Sydney and A Score for Fed Square (2022), commissioned by Fed Square and the National Gallery www.miasalsjo.com

Workshops


Visual Communication Design

This workshop will explore how Augmented Reality (AR) can enhance Visual Communication product designs and VCE Creative Arts subjects folios and assessment tasks. Through hands-on activities, students will discover how AR can bring their designs to life, add depth to storytelling, and create immersive digital experiences.

Desiree specialises in using digital tools to complement traditional design, interactive media, and immersive storytelling. This workshop will provide practical insights into integrating AR into product design, branding, and creative folios, aligning with syllabus outcomes at Levels 3 & 4.

Students are encouraged to bring their own smartphone or tablet to explore digital platforms available during VCE and experiment with AR tools firsthand.

Desiree Cross is a Dimboola-born-and-raised digital artist, augmented reality designer and storyteller passionate about using technology to engage audiences, extend learning and inspire social change. She holds s Bachelor of Arts in Multimedia from Victoria University, Desiree has worked in the creative industries across a diverse range of mediums such as animation, illustration, graphic design, motion design, and augmented reality.

She has created award winning animations and is passionate about educating the next generation of students.

Tracey Rigney has always had a love of storytelling from her Grandfather. Growing up in Dimboola, she is a Wotjobaluk and Ngarrindjeri woman, who draws inspiration from her people and culture. Tracey has dabbled in the arts space for over 25 years and is excited of this next chapter in her career that involves the business of Pink Lake Creative.

Tracey is a playwright and filmmaker currently embarking on her first feature film.

VCE Media

Explore key outcomes of the VCE Media subject from Units 3 & 4 with an experienced storyteller, artists and film maker Tracey Rigney. Tracey has a vast experience in the use of digital technologies in storytelling and the impact this has on sharing engaging stories.

Tracey will share her experiences as a Wotjobaluk and Ngarrindjeri woman in creating stories from her people and culture.

This workshop will encourage students to talk with peers and to engage critically with media and further their understand of the social construction of media.

Work of Tracey's include the story of the Mallee Fowl in 'Someone in the Dark' and films Endangered, Abolone, Man Real and Elders.



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Workshops

Art: Creative Practice

IN this workshop students will explore the role of research in developing creative ideas, using visual stimuli to guide their learning. By examining historical and cultural works, they will discover effective research methods and the importance of context in shaping new ideas. Building on their findings, students will translate inspiration into initial concepts through drawing and sketching. This activity aligns closely with the 'Research and Exploration' component of the Creative Practice, emphasizing the value of inquiry and experimentation in the artistic process

Brittany King is a dedicated science and art teacher at Horsham College with seven years of experience, including six years teaching VCE Art. She holds a combined bachelor's degree in education and visual arts and later expanded her expertise by studying science to teach across disciplines. Brittany specialises in painting and printmaking, bringing a passion for creativity and a deep understanding of artistic processes to her teaching.



Lauren van Katwyk

Lauren van Katwyk is the Curator at Horsham Regional Art Gallery. Lauren is an advocate for 'peer-led' programming, and enjoys working closely with artists and the community to develop exhibitions and projects, An approach she honed as Young People's Programme Intern at the Tate Modern/ Tate Britain in 2011.

Lauren has worked for over 15 years in galleries and arts organisations, including as Executive Manager of This is Not Art (an experimental arts festival in Newcastle, NSW) and roles at Newcastle Art Gallery and Maitland Regional Art Gallery in NSW.

VCE Art: Making and Exhibiting

This workshops will take place in the Gallery immersing students in an exhibition exploring its context, themes, enhancing display and discussing the institutions perspective.

Students will have a valuable opportunity to discuss artworks, collaborate with peers and explore exhibiting with an experienced Curator. The session will complementing their studies with the insights of designing exhibitions, how galleries support artists and expose students to parts of the unique collection at Horsham Regional Art Gallery and the conservation of works.
