

Anne Middleton Beyond feeling: the texture of time



Beyond feeling; the texture of time surveys the deeply personal and poetic aesthetic of Australian artist Anne Middleton over a period of thirty-five years. In 1983, a large suite of photographs by Frederick Allen Joyner (1863–1945) was presented to the National Gallery of Victoria by Mrs. Max Joyner. From this original group, seventy photographs—either duplicates or variant versions—were deaccessioned from the NGV collection in 2024 and warmly received into the Horsham Regional Art Gallery collection.

Horsham Regional Art Gallery, well known for its enduring support of Australian photography, is pleased to provide a new home for these significant works. These are the first works by Joyner to be acquired into our collection and consist mainly of gelatin silver photographs, ranging in size from postcard size to a sheet of paper.

F.A. Joyner was born in Adelaide in 1863. He was a solicitor and plant breeder as well as an accomplished photographer. Throughout his career, Joyner's lens captured iconic Australian landscapes—particularly the Flinders Ranges—as well as candid and staged portraits, domestic scenes, and industrial documentation. His photographs not only depict Australian rural life and culture, but also reveal a deep sensitivity to light, form, and the rhythms of country life.

Held in light: Con Kroker photographs from the collection



Conrad Otto Kroker (1910–1996) was a mid-20th-century Australian photographer who spent most of his life based in Horsham. The Horsham Regional Art Gallery is the custodian of more than 250 of his works, which capture his understanding and appreciation of photography as both an artistic and documentary medium, as well as his interest in the Australian environment.

Acknowledging the 30th anniversary of the artist's passing, this exhibition is drawn entirely from the Horsham Regional Art Gallery collection and revisits Kroker's work as both an artistic and environmental archive for modern audiences to appreciate and enjoy. This display has also been coordinated to accentuate a visit to the exhibition View from Here: Highlights from the National Gallery Collection, on loan from the National Gallery of Australia and on semi-permanent display in Horsham until mid-2027.

Contextualised alongside works by artists closely associated with early colonial Australian exploration (such as Thomas Clarke, Eugene von Guerard, and Nicholas Chevalier), Con Kroker's photographs speak to us as another form of exploration – highly detailed, considered, and affectionate renderings of the unique flora and fauna of our region.


